



Strategies for Developing Oracy in Spanish

	Purpose and Impact
Defending Conclusions	By defending conclusions, using given sentence stems, students think more critically about pronunciation, intonation, punctuation and vocabulary used. In doing so, students show a greater understanding of the Spanish language.
Group Discussion	The purpose of group discussion is to inspire curiosity so that students have a greater fascination about the language and country studied implementing cultural capital.
Self-reflection	Through the oracy progression, students are invited to change their mind based on what they have heard. In doing so, pupils develop their perspective and judgement of given historical evidence.
Active Listening	Within Spanish, students are expected to listen attentively to spoken language, from a range of people and sources, and show understanding by joining in and responding by using their knowledge of the Spanish language.
Engaging in conversation, tonal experimentation and practicing pronunciation.	Within Spanish, students are given a range of opportunities to verbally experiment with the Spanish language. In doing so, students aim to speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity.
