

CHARACTERISTICS OF EFFECTIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING

- Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning (CoETL) are in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (EYFS).
- CoEL reflect on the different ways that children learn.
- Playing and exploring children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go';
- Active learning children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements; and
- Creating and thinking critically children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things
