- We have worked with external companies to expand the number of after school clubs we provide.
- We have embedded a new scheme of work and maintained the number of taught hours per week.
- Using our scheme of work, we have introduced a number of new sports and activities across our school.
- We are committed to identifying talent and offering opportunities to our more gifted children to compete and develop their skills.
- We are a member of the YST and have used their assessment tool to review sport in our school.
- We are a member of the Aspire Sports Network and regularly attend network meetings and training sessions to develop our practice.
- We are a member of the Poltair School Sports Partnership and use this membership to access competitions and CPD opportunities.
- We have used our affiliations to provide in school coaching from external coaches.
- We are committed to increasing activity for all children across the school.
- We work closely with our local secondary school and participate in a range of cluster events.
- We are affiliated to several groups which provide opportunities for training and competition.
- We have worked with local clubs in our community to provide opportunities for children.
- We provide a range of residential opportunities outside of school for our children.
